**Text: I Thessalonians 5:21 (KJV)** 

Prove all things; hold fast that which is good.

The statement "prove all things, hold fast to that which is good" is a direct quote from the biblical book of 1 Thessalonians 5:21, where the Apostle Paul instructs believers to **thoroughly examine teachings and doctrines, discerning truth from falsehood**, and then to faithfully adhere to what is proven to be good and God's will. The phrase encourages an active, critical approach to understanding spiritual messages by testing them against God's word and scriptural truth, rather than passively accepting everything without question.

# **Understanding the Command:**

"Prove all things": This part of the verse calls for discernment and careful evaluation of all claims and teachings. Believers are not to blindly accept what they hear but are to test it by comparing it to the Holy Scriptures, the ultimate standard of truth. This is an encouragement to have a "ready mind" and to investigate, similar to the noble Bereans in Acts 17:11.

"Hold fast that which is good": Once something has been proven true and good through diligent examination, believers are then to embrace it firmly and resolutely. This means making it a part of one's life, holding on to it and practicing it in the face of opposition.

### **Understand the Context of the Command:**

**Spiritual Discernment:** Paul's instruction comes in the context of not "quench[ing] the Spirit" or disrespecting "prophesyings" (prophetic messages). It is a call to have a discerning attitude toward those who claim to speak for God, recognizing that some messages may be true and valuable, while others may be false.

**Practical Application:** The command is both a spiritual and practical instruction for daily living. It means to reject teachings contrary to Christ's doctrine and to embrace and live out the teachings that align with God's Word.

According as his divine power hath given unto us all things that pertain unto life and godliness, through the knowledge of him that hath called us to glory and virtue:

# Point #2: All of God's Will (His Instructions) Are Written in the Bible, Not in the Mind of Men

#### I Corinthians 14:37-38 (KJV)

- <sup>37</sup> If any man think himself to be a prophet, or spiritual, let him acknowledge that the things that I write unto you are the commandments of the Lord.
- <sup>38</sup> But if any man be ignorant, let him be ignorant.

### I Corinthians 1:10-13 (NAS)

<sup>10</sup> Now I urge you, brothers *and sisters*, by the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that you all agree and that there be no divisions among you, but that you be made complete in the same mind and in the same judgment. <sup>11</sup> For I have been informed concerning you, my brothers *and sisters*, by Chloe's *people*, that there are quarrels among you. <sup>12</sup> Now I mean this, that each one of you is saying, "I am with Paul," or "I *am* with Apollos," or "I *am* with Cephas," or "I *am* with Christ." <sup>13</sup> Has Christ been divided? Paul was not crucified for you, was he? Or were you baptized in the name of Paul?
